Charles Thurman, soldier of the Revolution, was born in Buckingham County, Virginia 06 February, 1760. Charles served in the Virginia militia from the time he was 15 (1775) to age 21 (1781). He is credited with 21 months of service from multiple militia tours of duty which on average were about three months in length. Virginia recognized out of state duty as duty with or as Continental Service. Charles would in the course of his duties participate in guarding Prisoners of War twice, march from South Carolina to Virginia in the “race for the Dan”, fight at the Battles of Guilford Courthouse and Siege of Yorktown (See Campaign BIO Summary – insert).
